14. A Curious History of Clothing in Communist China. Tuesday, April 8, 2008 at Cleveland State University.

Clothing was once prominent in understandings of what constituted the difference between China and the rest of the world. For outsiders it was the single most obvious feature of Chinese society during the Mao years. Professor Finnane's work combines an account of how fashion has been equated with modernity, progress and the West with a history of clothing in twentieth-century China. In this lecture she considers the fate of fashion in Communist China, showing that despite the difficulties of "dressing up" in the era of the Mao suit, there were some surprising points of convergence between fashions in China and the West during the Cold War years. 23. The Japanese Garden at the Wexner Center, May 23-25, 2008.

Take a magical ride on an incredible Japanese garden carpet. For more than two decades, TPO from Tuscany has distinguished itself as a "visual theater company," and The Children's Cheering Carpet is one of its crowning achievements. Bonsai, stones, water, a Zen garden, and other elements of a Japanese garden appear on the interactive, magic carpet stage. It initially seems like just a big white carpet, but its digital images and sounds respond to the pressure of the feet or body. As the performance begins, a company member tells a story about how the garden was born. Audience members sit around the carpet, and a dancer starts to animate areas of the surface corresponding to five gardens in the original story. Then children in the audience are invited to explore and animate the gardens themselves, experiencing the reconstructed natural environment through their own senses. The Columbus area "One Day Consulate" for Japanese Nationals will be held on June 11 for renewing passports. But you must apply by April 9, 2008. A copy of your passport must be submitted as part of the application, and you must bring your old passport on June 11 to receive a new passport. The current passport will expire when a new passport is issued. There is a rule which states that a new passport cannot be issued if you plan on going back to Japan between May 5 and June 11, 2008. If you are planning a trip to Japan during those dates, please contact the Detroit Consulate General beforehand.
